


The RP "zoning" legal framework in France

E : potential effective dose (mSv) in 1 hr (both external & internal)

DR : dose rate (mSv/h)

H : equivalent dose (mSv) in 1 hr


> 2003 : Decree 2003-296 (implemented in the labour code) :

- major changes in the RP legal framework
- first common requirements, regardless of the activity sector (NPP, hospital, ...)
- detailed for zoning in 2006 by an Order

➢ 2011 : Prospective assessment process of the <u>overall</u> french RP legal framework :

- anticipation (project of European BSS)
- experience feedback (for the zoning item, for example : problems to implement rules in the medical field, « hot spots », …)

Expertise process launched by the French Safety Authority (ASN) jointly with the General Directorate of Labour (DGT)



* should be published on the ASN's website by the end of 2012 (simultaneously)



Why considering this expertise process as innovative ?

Advisory Comitees has to :

- elaborate a survey of national and <u>international</u> operational practices
- <u>propose</u> one or several regulatory systems in order to define and manage the access to regulated areas

> Actions :

- Creation of a task group « GT-Zonage » among the Advisory Comitees
- Submission of a feedback form (designed for operational actors in every activity sectors : medical, industrial, nuclear, transport...)
- Organization of a national seminary that brought together about 200 persons (see : <u>http://www.colloque-zonage-radiologique.org/mitizi/</u>)
- Requirement of the support of CEPN to compare international practices regarding regulated areas (regulations/practices, comparison, ISOF European Symposium, Prague, 20 June 2012 - Definition and access to restricted areas regarding radiation protection issues analysis)
