- 4. 2010 Cambridge: Feedback from Events




Motivation 4. RBM in Cambridge 2010

- 2009 ISOE Symposium in Vienna, Report from Helena JANZEKOVIC about database on events concerning RP:
 - IRS-Reports (IAEA) does not include enough information to get Lessons Learned in the RP field
 - some national or bilateral database are better (e.g. OSIRIS)
- Topic proposed at 2009 Management Board in Paris: "How are lessons learned from radiological events drawn up, reported and distributed among RPpersons (experts, officers, commissioners ...) in
 - NPP (units, plants, companies)
 - training facilities, association and reg. bodies"



"Feedback from Events"

- lessons learned from events are highly valuable:
- they show necessary improvements on actual problems
- which are not theoretical (as in the RPplanning or in some training courses)
- but really (practical)
- lessons learned have to reach all persons who may be concerned





Aspects of Interest

- 1. Which **criteria** are defined for nomination an event as an event of interest? Which terms and definitions are used?
- 2. Which requirements are installed by the authorities for event analysis management in NPP?
- 3. How is the information **reported and distributed outside the NPP**?
- 4. How does the information is **brought into the training** and education of staff?
